Exhibits & Entrants Guide

EXHIBIT INFORMATION - Rules and Regulations

- 1. Competition is open to all individuals in Chatham and surrounding counties.
- 2. Exhibits may be entered on the following dates and times: Tuesday, September 17th
 Through Wednesday, September 18th from 10am-6pm. Non-perishable exhibit will be accepted Thursday, September 19th from 9am 10am. Perishables must be entered Thursday, September 19th, 8:00am-9:30am. All baked goods become the property of the Fair and will be auctioned off Friday, September 20. Proceeds will go to the Fair Association.
- 3. Every reasonable effort will be made by officers of the Fair Association and those in charge of the premises to protect items on exhibit from loss or damage. However, the Association will not be responsible should loss or damage occur.
- 4. Articles, exhibits, awards and ribbons can be removed from the main building after 5pm on Sunday, September 22nd, or Monday or Tuesday, September 23rd-24th, 11am-6pm. Livestock and poultry may be removed through the rear gate beginning Sunday September 22nd from 4-
- 7pm the rear gate will be opened at 10am on Monday, September 23rd and remain open all day for livestock and poultry removal. All animals must be removed from the fairgrounds by 6:00pm on Monday.
- 5. The Fair Association will not be responsible for animals not removed by 6:00pm on Monday. If art, articles or exhibits must be removed by 6:00pm on Tuesday, September 24th unless special permission is requested.

Entries

- 1. Every exhibit must be entered in a department, class, or category chosen by the exhibitor. No exhibitor may enter more than one item of the same variety in any class. Based on the number of entries, categories may be subdivided.
- 2. The right is reserved to reject any entry; no unworthy exhibit will be awarded a premium.
- 3. Canned goods must be in standard canning jars. No mayonnaise or pickle jars accepted.
- 4. Classes 1-7 have an adult and youth category. There is no separate category for Children Only. All persons in these categories will compete against others in their age groups (adults against adults, youth category participants against youth ages 9-19). Children ages 5-8 will not participate in competition. Ages 5-8 are considered Child (C). Ages 9-19 are considered Youth (Y). All entrants ages 5-19 will have a green participation ribbon placed on the item at check in.
- 5. Premiums will be awarded on merit. Ribbons will only be awarded to the best entries in each category. Example: If there are 10 plates of potatoes, only the top 3 will be awarded ribbons. The following colors are being used to designate awards:
- First Place: Blue Ribbon
- Second Place: Red Ribbon
- Honorable Mention (HM): Purple Ribbon (no premium)
- 6. If there is only one article (no competition) in a class, it can be eligible for a ribbon if it is of acceptable quality, at the discretion of the judges.
- 7. All exhibits to be judged (except booths) must go through the office to be registered and tagged before being placed on exhibit. Exhibits not tagged will not be judged.
- 8. Judging will take place Thursday, September 19th, beginning promptly at 11:00 a.m., for all exhibits. Only judges and assistants will be allowed in the exhibit areas during the judging.

DEPARTMENT 2 HORTICULTURE PRODUCTS

Display home-grown products in single plates of 5 each unless otherwise noted. Entries may be disqualified if determined to be infested with insects or disease, deceptive in presentation, or, not consistent with guidelines for entry. Variety must be written and label attached. Fruit will be judged according to each variety, but only the best in each category will be given a blue, red or purple ribbon. Special attention should be given to uniformity and appearance. For each crop certain characteristics will outweigh others. Understand the nature of the crop and its end use.

HM

Appearance: size appropriate to the crop, appropriate shape, uniformity and consistency of color, gloss.

Freedom from Defects: sprouting, curling, wilting, shriveling, drying, bruises, scratches, punctures, cuts, abrasions, splitting, cracking, chilling injury, sunscald, fungal or bacterial blemishes, insect injury, hail damage, and chemical injury are all undesirable.

Maturity: appropriate for the end use of the crop.

Uniformity: all items in a presentation similar in all respects - size, color, absence of defects, maturity.

<u>Presentation</u>: entered in correct category; specified number submitted.

DEPARTMENT 3 - FLOWERS AND PLANTS

No exhibitor may enter more than one plant of the same variety, or a total of 5 plants if space becomes an issue. No flowers will be accepted in a pot with a bottom larger than 8 inches. Name must be legibly and correctly written on a stiff card and attached. Blue, red and purple ribbons will be given in each variety.

Flower specimens, arrangements, and plants are judged on the basis of size, color, maturity, freedom from defects, and presentation. In all cases characteristics of the individual species or cultivar are important. Certain qualities may be more or less significant depending on category.

Entries may be disqualified if determined to be infested with insects or disease, deceptive in presentation, or not consistent with guidelines for entry.

Size: length of stem, number and size of leaves, size of the-flower itself, all in proportion.

Color: intensity and uniformity; fully developed.

Maturity: appropriate to species; flowers picked fully mature may lose petals quickly.

<u>Freedom from Defects</u>: disease, insect damage, physical damage, incomplete development, wilting, shriveling, drying, chemical injury, sunscald, and nutritional deficiencies are considered undesirable.

Presentation: entered in correct category according to guidelines, arranged for three dimensional viewing.

DEPARTMENT 4 - LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

HEALTH REGULATIONS

(General Livestock and Poultry)

All animals must be accompanied by an official health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian or an approved State or Federally employed Veterinarian. The health certificate should contain the following:

- 1. Name and address of exhibitor.
- 2. Description of each animal including breed, age, sex and registration, tattoo or ear tag numbers.
- 3. A statement by the veterinarian signing the health certificate that the animals listed are not infected with, or have been recently exposed to any communicable disease to the best of his knowledge.
- 4. Information relating to brucellosis. The animals:
- Originate from a Certified Brucellosis-Free Herd*; or
- Originate from a herd not under quarantine and have passed a negative official blood test for brucellosis within 60 days prior to admission to the fair, except that animals under eight months of age, officially vaccinated dairy heifers under 20 months of age and officially vaccinated heifers of the beef breeds less than 24 months of age need not be tested.
- 5. Information relating to tuberculosis. The animals:
- Originate in an Accredited Tuberculosis-Free Herd* which has been tested within the past 12 months or
- Originate in a herd not under quarantine and the animals to be exhibited have passed a negative official test for tuberculosis within 60 days prior to admission to the Fair; except that animals under 8 months of age need not be tested.
- 6. All horses must show proof of negative Coggins' Test.

No unworthy animal will be awarded a premium. When there are fewer animals shown in the class than the number of premiums offered, the judge may, at his discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animal or animals deserve.

TO EXHIBITORS

The Fair Management will use diligence to ensure the safety of livestock entered for exhibition or display, but under no circumstances will it be responsible for loss, injury, theft or damage by fire, lighting, wind or any other agency, to such livestock on exhibition or display. All livestock on exhibition will be cared for by personnel designated by the Fair. All stalls and pens will be well bedded one time by the Fair, and when needed, free of charge. Exhibitors will be required to furnish their own feed for their animals. All cattle must be halter-broken and on a lead chain or rope to participate in the Fair

Fruits and tomatoes should be processed in boiling water bath and low acid vegetables processed in steam pressure canner.

Color - 25 points - that of natural fruit or vegetable

Liquid - 15 points - appropriate for product and method of processing Flavor* - natural flavor should be preserved as much as possible in canning. Don't overpower flavor with sugar

Appearance - 30 points - uniformly well-ripened products; no defective or over-ripe

fruits or vegetables. Only young and tender vegetables should be canned.

Appropriate Size - 15 points - uniformity and shape and size appropriate for product as to jars, only pints or quarts

Pack and Fill 15 points - containers should be standard quart pint or half pint canning jars. Attractiveness of packing, appropriate/standard sizing of containers for specific items. Filled to level specified by standard recommendations.

TOTAL POINTS - 100

*Flavor is very important, but cannot actually be judged since jars are not opened. All containers except Canned Fruits and Vegetables will be opened for judging.

- a. Uses striking facts and clinching arguments to show that idea or product is desirable.
- b. Shows that proposed idea or product is easy to understand, adopt, convenient, inexpensive and satisfying.

a. Is original in design in whole or in part.
